### Presentation of the IPSAS–IFRS Alignment Dashboard

#### Question

- Whether the IPSASB agrees with replacing the IFRS Tracking Table with the IPSAS–IFRS Alignment Dashboard as a standing agenda item.

#### Detail

##### *Background*

- The IPSASB Chair instructed staff to develop a dashboard showing the alignment of IPSAS with the equivalent IFRS, where applicable. The dashboard should be supported with a high-level overview of the main IPSAS-IFRS differences.
- Agenda Item 13.3.1 includes the staff's recommended IPSAS–IFRS Alignment Dashboard (the Dashboard).

##### *Characteristics of the Dashboard*

- The Dashboard includes three tables:
  - Table 1 – IPSAS and Equivalent IFRS—Summary.** This table summarizes:
    - All IPSAS with an effective date after January 1, 2018, but not the IPSAS they will replace.
    - All IPSAS and the equivalent IFRS.
    - Legend 'Degree of public sector specificity' – The greater the degree of blue in the circle, reflects the more public sector specific nature of the IPSAS.
      - Quarter-moon – IPSAS with minor public sector guidance added (public sector terminology and minor modifications), which corresponds to step 4 of the [Process for Reviewing and Modifying IASB Documents](#).
      - Half-moon – IPSAS with public sector guidance added (public sector terminology, and public sector modifications), which corresponds to step 3 of the [Process for Reviewing and Modifying IASB Documents](#).
      - Three-quarters-moon – Public Sector Specific IPSAS with some IFRS guidance, which corresponds to step 5 of the [Process for Reviewing and Modifying IASB Documents](#).
      - Full-moon – Public sector specific IPSAS. No text from IFRS.
    - Legend 'Degree updated for relevant IFRS changes':

- (b) **Table 2 – IFRS with no Equivalent IPSAS.** This table provides the IFRS for which there is no equivalent IPSAS. The table al and a brief description on:
  - (i) The IFRS that the IPSASB already took a decision not to start a project because of its diminished relevance to the public sector; and
  - (ii) How the IPSASB is dealing with these IFRS in its current work plan and proposed 2019-2023 work plan; and
- (c) **Table 3 – IPSAS and Equivalent IFRS—Detail.** This table provides the main public sector differences from the equivalent IFRS (list is not exhaustive) and the relevant IFRS amendments not yet considered by the IPSASB.

### *Benefits of the Dashboard*

5. The dashboard has the following benefits:
  - (a) **Simplicity** – The Dashboard summarizes in a concise manner the current alignment status providing a quick way to understand the IPSAS-IFRS alignment by standard. The summary Dashboard should be particularly helpful for presentations.
  - (b) **Understandability** – The Dashboard presents the alignment status in a graphic way, enhancing its understandability.
  - (c) **Comprehensiveness** – The Dashboard includes the status of all IPSAS and IFRS. It details the main public sector modifications and captures the relevant IFRS amendments not yet considered by IPSASB.
  - (d) **Digestible** – The Dashboard is much more concise than the current tracking table. It also is designed with the user of the document in mind and includes hyperlinks between the relevant sections and information to help in navigating the document.

### *Staff's recommendation*

6. Staff recommends that the Dashboard replaces current Agenda Item 1.6 as the standing item for IPSASB meetings.<sup>1</sup>

### **Decisions required**

7. Does the IPSASB agree with staff's overall approach to the Dashboard? Does the IPSASB have suggestions or further ideas for staff to consider to improve the Dashboard?

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<sup>1</sup> Staff notes that the IFRS Tracking Table will continue to be updated by staff before each IPSASB meeting and will be used only as a staff paper, not to be distributed to IPSASB, except if requested.

**Use of the term ‘Alignment’ versus ‘Convergence’****Question**

1. Whether the IPSASB agrees to use of the term ‘alignment’ rather the ‘convergence’ when referring to the IPSASB’s work in considering the applicability of IFRS guidance to the public sector when developing IPSAS.
2. Whether the IPSASB agrees to use the term alignment going forward in IPSASB literature and other documents.

**Detail***‘Alignment’ versus ‘Convergence’ Label of the IPSAS–IFRS Alignment Dashboard*

2. The term “convergence” is used pervasively throughout the IPSAS literature and other IPSASB documents. However, during the proposed strategy outreach some constituents questioned if the term might contribute to the negative view of the IPSASB’s work related to the IASB standards. This is because ‘convergence’ may downplay the significant effort the IPSASB invests in developing IPSAS, when assessing the appropriateness of IFRS requirements being adapted for the public sector.
3. The view is that the term ‘alignment’ better reflects the active process the IPSASB undertakes when considering the applicability of IFRS guidance to the public sector and therefore proposes its use instead of convergence.
4. Staff notes that the term ‘alignment’ is normally used in the context of Government Finance Statistics. Therefore, the use of the term ‘alignment’ in the context of IFRS would also mean a neutral approach when considering both accounting frameworks in the development of IPSAS.

**Decisions required**

5. Does the IPSASB agree to:
  - (a) Use ‘Alignment’ instead of ‘Convergence’ when referring to the IPSASB’s work to consider the applicability of IFRS guidance to the public sector?
  - (b) That staff should make the consequential updates to replace ‘convergence’ with ‘alignment’ where appropriate in the IPSASB literature?

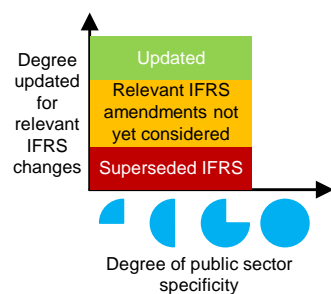


